English Language



Making your subject preferences

You will receive a letter on Monday morning with the key points from this presentation. There will be a link to the preferences form in this letter.

You will be asked to pick either Geography or History as your Individuals and Societies (Humanities) subject.

You must then then select 3 subjects, one from each of 3 separate lists. These are your subject preferences. All subjects are equally weighted in preference, what you pick in list 1 is not more important than your choice in list 3.

PE and computing - iMedia/Computer Science, are offered as either a GCSE or BTEC course. At this stage you will just select the subject and not the type of course. GCSE and BTEC courses are different, and suit different ways of learning and working. Subject teachers will place you on the most appropriate course for your way of working.

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Please note...

We always try to give everyone the subject choices that they select, however, this is not always possible and depends on how many students pick each subject every year.

Before you make your choices, remember the following important details below:

- Computer Science requires a grade 5 in maths to study the GCSE qualification.
- It is recommended that you play sport outside of school in order to study PE.
- It is recommended that you play an instrument outside of school if you wish to study Music.

Talk to your current teacher before you make your decision as they will help you

Take your time with the form. We do not operate a first come first served system, but you must meet the submission deadline date which is: **9:00 am Wednesday 11th February**

We recognise this can be a stressful process for some students and families, however your child's college team and teachers are available for support and guidance. Please remember it is not always possible for every student to get their perfect set of choices which is why we ask for more preferences than the number of subjects studied.
